



Ambassador Yip's Visit to SBB Cambodia February 2025



From the Senior Leadership Team

Dear Ambassador Yíp,

It is a pleasure to welcome you to see our work on the ground in schools in Kralanh. As of 1 January 2025, this work is being led by SBB Cambodia, our local NGO.

We are delighted that you are the first official visitor to see the work that SBB Cambodia is undertaking in schools.

Our organisation, SBB Cambodia, has emerged as a result of the growth and success of SBB Australia over many years. This growth and success has in turn been possible only as a result of funding from the Australian government and from Australians. Since 2017, SBB Australia has been fortunate to receive significant ANCP funding which has enabled us to expand our reach into new districts. In particular, the experience and learnings acquired from implementing our ANCP-funded EdTech project in Battambang has equipped us well to now work in further-behind districts such as Kralanh, here in Siem Reap Province.

Today Cambodia has one of the weakest education systems in the world but change is happening, and we at SBB Cambodia are extremely proud to be part of that change. While modest in scale, our work is evidence-based and research informed. Children in our programs do better at school. There is a very strong correlation between SBB interventions and students' achievement of maths and literacy Minimum Proficiency Levels (MPLs).

After three years of our interventions in Battambang there was a 29% increase in the number of students reaching MPLs. Now here in Siem Reap, after barely one year of our interventions, there has already been a 12% increase in students reaching MPLs. More children are learning in school.

Meanwhile, Australian Award Scholar Kim Ann, who you met in Phnom Penh last year, will not be with us today. She left Cambodia in January to begin studying in Adelaide. Kim Ann comes from the district you are visiting today, so she is with us in spirit and has recorded a special video message which we look forward to showing you.

For now we want to thank you once again Ambassador for your presence today. It matters a great deal to all of us.

Our Impact this Year

















65% of Grade 1-3 children reached Minimum Proficiency Levels in literacy compared with only **36%** in control schools.

Derek, an Australian citizen, has a background in compliance. He is based out of the Siem Reap office.




Naret Sok - District Governor | Kralanh

Out of all 81 countries that participated in PISA 2022 Cambodia placed 81st. Our work is now being implemented in north-western Cambodia, where access to quality education is poorest and students' educational outcomes are lowest. This means there is enormous opportunity to achieve transformational change for the most disadvantaged children and communities in Cambodia.

About SBB

Since 2009, SBB has been improving the quality of education in government primary schools through evidence-based programs, research, and policy input into teacher development. Our work aligns directly with SDG 4 Quality Education and SDG 17 Partnership for Goals. SBB Cambodia provides training and mentoring to school teachers in areas where they need the most support - maths, literacy, and classroom management. We engage parents and other community members to build an understanding of the value of educating their children; and work with the local and national government to foster a commitment to improving the education system nationally.

SBB Australia has been accredited by the Australian Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade (DFAT), responsible for managing the Australian Government's aid program, since 2017. We receive support through the Australian NGO Cooperation Program (ANCP).

ANCP Funded Projects in Siem Reap

Literacy Teacher Mentoring

The Literacy Teacher Mentoring Project focuses on improving teachers' professional knowledge and skills in literacy teaching. It introduces various universally proven approaches and methodologies which have been adapted and tested in the context of teaching Khmer literacy, and enables teachers to practice them. As teachers become confident with different methodologies, selecting and applying those that work best for them and their students, literacy competency among students improves.



Maths Teacher Mentoring

Our UNESCO Award-winning mentoring project saw Grade 1-3 students' achievements in maths improve by an average of 40% points. The Maths Teacher Mentoring Project is designed to build on that success, enabling teachers to adapt alternative methods for teaching maths and use them in their classrooms. Ongoing mentoring equips teachers to better respond to their students' needs, and as they build their skills, they have more enthusiasm and enjoyment for teaching maths.
